



Timothy W. Roberts, Director At-Large

Timothy W. Roberts is serving his second term as Alameda County Management Employees Association (ACMEA) Director-At-Large. He was first elected to the ACMEA Board of Directors in late 2016 for a one-year term starting January 2017 and was re-elected for a two-year term which commenced in January 2018.

Mr. Roberts is a Contract Administrator/Program Financial Specialist in the Alameda County Social Services Agency's (ACSSA) Administration and Finance Department. During his almost 26-year tenure with Alameda County he has also served in the capacity of Acting Executive Assistant/Public Information Officer for the ACSSA.

Prior to joining the ACSSA, Mr. Roberts worked as Communication Coordinator for the Alameda County Women and Infants Demonstration Project (WIDP). The project was a national five-year CDC-funded AIDS education/prevention project initially administered by the Alameda County Public Health Dept. (ACPHD). The project moved to the ACSSA after its Principal Investigator was appointed ACSSA Director.

Mr. Roberts also served in a similar communication capacity for the Alameda County Male Action Network (ACMAN)—a male health and teen pregnancy prevention program of the ACPHD. His experience working for programs targeting teen and young adult males also includes a stint as Director of The Young Men as Fathers Program (YMFP). The YMFP was a parenting/mentoring program funded by the California Youth Authority. The program operated under the auspices of the Court Appointed Special Advocates Program (CASA) which was housed in the Alameda County Probation Dept.



Mr. Roberts' professional experience includes working as a print and broadcast journalist and public affairs administrator for two of Oakland-based Kaiser Permanente's northern California medical facilities. He is also principal/owner of TWR Enterprises—a communication consulting firm.

In addition to serving on the ACMEA Board of Directors, Mr. Roberts is president of the Hesperian Villas Homeowner's Association Board of Directors, San Leandro, California; a member of the Board of Directors of Man 2 Man—a Bay Area-based nonprofit organization and ministry that teaches life skills—including anger management and conflict resolution—to young men; and is a member of the Alameda County Fathers Corps which advocates for and supports fathers and father-figures and the agencies/organizations that serve them.

He holds a Master of Science in Journalism from Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois and a BA in Mass Communication (Minor in Sociology) from CSU, Hayward (now CSU, Eastbay).
