I am honored to be reelected. I have served as an ACMEA Treasurer for 12 years and have participated in the three collective bargaining processes and fiscal audits. I will continue to fight for the enhancement of wages, benefits, and working conditions of our membership.

I hold a Bachelor's Degree in Administration/Finance and have 34 plus years of finance experience. Prior to Alameda County, I climbed the corporate ladder with Bank of America, for thirteen years, holding various posts and ending my career in the private sector as a Financial Analyst for the Private Banking Division. In 1998, I began a career with Alameda County Public Health Department as a Financial Services Specialist II. From 2001 through 2004, as a Program Financial Specialist for Social Services Agency, I was assigned to the Refugee Program, the Associated Community Action Program's (ACAP) Community Action Board (CAB), and Governing Board, which was made up of 13 elected officials, on all policy matters and funding decisions. From 2004 through 2005, I worked as a Program Financial Specialist for the Probation Department. There, I was fiscally responsible for the Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act, Community Probation.

From 2005 through 2009, I worked with Social Services Agency, Department of Adult and Aging Services, Area Agency on Aging as a Program Financial Specialist as a programmatic/fiscal agent between the County and various service providers, State, other funding sources and interact with planning councils and boards and provided training and technical assistance. In 2008, I was given the opportunity to be the first Alameda County Program Executive Director for the Alameda County Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program. Under my leadership and successful planning, I directed and coordinated the program (Mandated under the Federal Older American Act) and services delivery of certified ombudsman personnel and volunteers engaged in administering ombudsman service to 355 residential facilities and 76 skilled nursing facilities with a total of 12,940 beds. Due to my success, today, Alameda County Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program is an In-House Service Program.



From 2009 to present, I am the Chief Financial Officer with the Department of Environmental Health, where I have applied my financial expertise and I am responsible for the department's budget. I oversee the finance office, which consists of the Billing, Accounting and the Finance Unit. In addition, I hold leadership roles in the Health Care Services Agency Finance Council and the Agency Leadership Team.
