I am honored to be re-elected. I have served as an ACMEA Treasurer for 12 years and have participated in three collective bargaining processes, and underwent numerous fiscal audits. I will continue to fight for the enhancement of wages, benefits, and working conditions of our members.

My academic major is in Administration/Finance, with 34 plus years of finance experience. I began my career with Bank of America in 1985. I climbed the corporate ladder for thirteen years, holding various posts and ending my career in the private sector as a Senior Financial Analyst for the Private Banking Division. In 1998, I began a career with Alameda County Public Health Department as a Financial Services Specialist II. From 2001 through 2004, as a Program Financial Specialist for Alameda County Social Services Agency, I was assigned to the Refugee Program, and the Associated Community Action Program (ACAP) which was governed by a Community Action Board and Governing Board made up of 13 elected officials that dealt with all policy matters and funding decisions.

From 2004 through 2005, I was hired as a Program Financial Specialist for the Alameda County Probation Department. There, I was fiscally responsible for the Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act, Community Probation. From 2005 through 2009, I was assigned to the Alameda County Social Services Agency, Department of Adult and Aging Services, Area Agency on Aging, as a Program Financial Specialist, operating as a programmatic/fiscal agent between the County, Federal, State, and various funding sources. In addition, I interacted with planning councils and boards, and provided training and technical assistance to community based providers.

In 2008, I was given the opportunity to be the first Alameda County Program Executive Director for the Alameda County Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program. Under my leadership and successful planning, I directed and coordinated the program, mandated



under the Federal Older American Act. Through the services delivery of certified ombudsman personnel and volunteers, I administered ombudsman service to 355 residential facilities and 76 skilled nursing facilities with a total of 12,940 beds. Due to great successful achievements through all efforts applied, Alameda County Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program is currently an In-House Service Program.

Currently, I am the Chief Financial Officer with the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health. I have applied my financial expertise and I am responsible for the department's budget since 2009. I oversee the finance office which consists of the Billing, Accounting and the Finance Unit. In addition, I hold leadership roles in the Health Care Services Agency Finance Council and the Agency Leadership Team.
